

## **ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT POLICY**

### **Management Commitment**

Taylor Made Joinery Interiors Limited recognises that it has responsibilities for the wider environment and to the local community. We are committed in complying with all relevant environmental legislation at local, regional and national levels, as a minimum performance and strive to continually improve environmental performance and protect the environment through the provision of appropriate initiatives, controls, resources and training of employees. Our aim is to minimise any adverse impacts we may have to air, water and land through our activities, products and services. Directors, management and supervisory staff have responsibilities for the implementation of the policy and must ensure that environmental issues are given adequate consideration in the planning and day-to-day supervision of all work and provides a framework for providing environmental objectives.

### **Environmental Policy**

In order to achieve this, an Environmental Management System has been established that complies with the International Standard ISO 14001:2015, FSC Standard and PEFC Standard. This establishes environmental understanding and control by systems and procedures, under the direction of the Directors, the senior management team with the support of all employees, primary suppliers and contractors. This policy is communicated to all staff and operatives via training and tool box talks and is reviewed annually. It is also available to the public and interested parties upon request and can be viewed on our web site. Management objectives and targets are established and reviewed on an annual basis to implement the Environmental Policy. These are based on the following:

- Ensuring compliance to environmental legislation and any other requirements
- Minimisation of waste through responsible waste management and monitoring
- Minimisation of energy, materials and utilities
- Prevention of pollution
- Reduction of carbon based emissions
- Substitution of hazardous and non-recyclable materials where possible
- Promoting the use of sustainable timber through the use of the FSC and PEFC chain of custody schemes
- Promoting the use of renewable sustainable resources, re-use and recycling
- Identify and manage key risks and have suitable procedures in place for the management of environmental incidents and emergencies
- The maintenance of workforce awareness of environmental issues
- Communicating/engaging in dialogue with interested parties.

The effectiveness of the Environmental Management System is monitored and maintained by regular audits and a Management Review.
